"Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments (Joel 2:12-13)."

"Dear brothers and sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ, on this day the Church begins a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope. Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless this Lententide for us so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts and keep the feast in sincerity and truth."

With these words the service for Ash Wednesday will begin on March 5. It is a wonderful, succinct explanation of what the season of Lent is all about. This is an important time in the Church, and it is important for you and your life in Christ. During this time we have a chance to reflect upon our sinfulness and our need for a Savior. We also have a chance to hear again all of the things that God has done for us in Christ to show us grace, to forgive us of our sin, and to bring us life.

This is also a chance for us to consider once again what our life looks like as we follow our Lord. As is suggested, it is one that ought to reflect devotion where the we follow Christ and his Word rather than the ways of this world or the desires of our heart. It is a life of self-denial that seeks to have God first in all things. And it is a time of repentance, recognizing that we have become too comfortable in our sins at times, that we have ignored God's Law thinking that our way is better than God's, and we have thought too narrowly about what God has to say to us. Thus, we see a chance to turn around and change our mind, to pursue the things of God and to recognize that in his Word, God is supplying us with every good thing we need for true life and salvation.

It is with these things in mind that the Church undergoes all that it does in this holy season. I encourage you to be part of all it. Yes, it will mean sacrificing some of your time. It may mean your DVR stays full until after Easter. It may mean letting go of those things that you know are no good for you but you consume them or do them anyway. And it does mean spending more time in the Word and prayer that the inscription of Christ crucified for you may be imprinted upon your heart more deeply, and so that, as will be said on Ash Wednesday, we may come to Easter with a glad heart and truly celebrate the resurrection and the eternal life that Christ has won for us. Have a blessed Lententide!

On my heart imprint Your image, Blessed Jesus, King of grace, That life's riches, cares, and pleasures Never may Your work erase;

Let the clear inscription be: Jesus, crucified for me, Is my life, my hope's foundation, And my glory and salvation (LSB #422)!

#### **Music Notes:**

Create in me a clean heart – the congregation and choir sings these words from the Divine Service every week and will do so again on Ash Wednesday. The choir also sings the text in its larger context as we pause the liturgy that day to remember that we are dust and will return to the dust. As one by one, people come to receive ashes, the silence, the starkness, the chanted singing of the Psalm may allow more focused attention on the text than might happen with its frequent repetition at the offertory as part of the Divine Service. Pray it, together with King David as we begin the Lenten Journey and make our way toward Holy Week and Easter.

The Psalm reminds us that, while a physical offering is often received & presented as we sing those words, God's desire is that we humbly and willingly offer, not sacrifices, but ourselves; that we ask for mercy, we ask to be washed, made clean - even whiter than snow - on the inside, as ashes blacken our foreheads and our failings remind us of our constant need for God. Cleansed and unburdened we can experience the joy of God's salvation, walking alongside our Lord.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from your presence and take not your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.

Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation,
and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. Psalm 51:10–17

...Then will I teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will be converted unto thee... Blessed to receive Christ's forgiveness, to have sins and guilt removed, to be delivered from death and have joy restored, what follows is to live in God's love; to teach by showing that love to others (so they, too, will be converted) and to sing of God's righteousness – mighty, and fulfilling tasks undertaken by the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

If you would like to do that in a tangible way – to show love and sing of God's righteousness - with others in preparation for our weekly worship, St. John's has a choir that gathers on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm. There is room in the chancel for more singers to surround the altar and help lead the song in our liturgies. We welcome new faces and new voices – or familiar faces willing to share their voices! Speak to me if you would like to know more about putting your faith and voice into action in this servant ministry at St. John's.


