Just as many of you stated a few weeks ago, I heartily agree: it is hard to believe that 20 years has gone by since I was ordained and installed at St. John's as your pastor. Like with many things in life, there are days that drag on and there have been times that have been filled with challenges and sorrows, but the years have passed by us in the blink of an eye. It is, perhaps, a small glimpse into the reality of God himself for whom "a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like a day."

As I reflect on my life and ministry over the past 20 years, I wish I could offer you a list of things that I have learned and some sage wisdom, but having literally grown up in the pastoral ministry before your eyes, you know many of those lessons already because we have experienced them together. Some of those lessons have come the hard way, but most of them have come about as you have helped to carry me along by the grace you have shown to me. And when it comes to sage wisdom, I can only echo the words of Saint Paul who said, "I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." Knowledge of him by faith is the highest wisdom there is. I could also think about various big moments in our history since I have been here, but there again, we have been through them together and it was only because we were together that they came to pass.

So as I sit here 20 years into the ministry to which Christ has set me and to which you have called me to serve, what do I think about it all? The answer is simple, and yet deeply profound.

First, I recall the overwhelming joy of serving God's people. As I said, there are days and even seasons that are difficult, but every one of them has been an opportunity to see the Gospel have its way with me and us. Mostly, however, there is the joy of the ministry, something that as I mentioned in a newsletter article about a year ago, can only come about through a long pastorate. There are many families for whom I have had the privilege of presiding at baptisms, confirmations, weddings, and funerals. I call it a privilege because these are significant moments in any family, and not only have I been part of them, but in many cases, you have welcomed me in like I was part of the family celebrating these things. While these milestone moments are great, I have to say that the every Sabbath day stuff of ministry is even more enjoyable. Being able to preach and teach and place Christ's body and blood into your hands and mouths is a joyful thing, for I know how such things have sustained you in your lives of faith. It is not about me, of course, but about Christ who is at work in these Means of Grace, and for the blessing of being Christ's voice and hands there is tremendous joy even under the responsibility that brings.

Second, I consider all the ways that God has truly blessed me and my family over the past 20 years (really 22 if you want to include vicarage as well!). Personally, the community of Sayville and the congregation of St. John's has become a home for us, physically and spiritually. We have lived here longer than anywhere else in our life, we started and raised a family here, and we have been blessed by a church family who has been there for us in all kinds of ways, especially since our family is spread out over the country and not next

door. It has been a blessing to work with various leaders in the church and to see them utilize their gifts in service to Christ and this congregation. I have been blessed to have a staff to work with who has been tremendous in what they have to offer behind the scenes, often giving so much of themselves even on their own time to see the ministry of St. John's move forward. It has also been a blessing and a privilege to work with Cindy and Rex ever since I have been here. They have helped me grow in my musical leadership abilities and we have been able to collaborate on some great events over the years. Many a pastor have expressed some jealousy over the level of musical and liturgical leadership we have, and I do not take it for granted a single day. There are so many blessings that they are too many number.

And lastly, I have and will always recall the people of St. John's who make it what it is. Since day one that a couple of young kids set foot on Sayville soil (sand?), this congregation has been a welcoming place. It has been such a joy to get to know you and your families, to experience so many things with you, to learn from you, and to see how you live out your lives of faith, especially in challenging times. Even now that we have become a sort of fixture around here, your care and compassion are still readily evident in many ways, and for that, my family and I are eternally grateful. So many relationships have been built here, and friendships made that, no matter where life might lead us or you in the future, St. John's and Sayville will always be part of who we are. We continue to appreciate this church family more than you know.

All of this is to say that it has been an amazing 20 years of being here and having the opportunity to labor alongside you in this corner of God's vineyard. Thank you for your love and support along the way. It is absolutely true what Paul said above. God is faithful toward us, having brought us into fellowship in Christ Jesus together so that we might rejoice in his blessings and live in the joy and hope of life with him in his kingdom forever. Such is what the last 20 years of ministry among you has been, and so it shall be going forward until the day we are together with the Lord forever!

It centered on loneliness, difficulty finding friends, and the resulting prohibitive costs of eating out with current or prospective friends.

The hymn "What a friend we have in Jesus" (LSB 770) comes to mind, assuring us that Christ bears all our sins and grief; He hears our thoughts and prayers, and grants us his peace. Jesus is with us in trials and temptations and sees our troubled world. He is faithful. He shares our sorrows and knows us from the inside out. He is there when others forsake us and holds us in his arms when others are not willing or able to do so. He died for us. *In Him* is where one finds one's very best friend.

Responding in kind is a place to start. Be a friend to make a friend. The cost is not usually one of dollars; but more about listening, truth telling, showing kindness, generosity, self-sacrifice, giving time, being present, being faithful. Being a true friend takes work and intention. It takes being Christ-like; it takes love.

I'm grateful for those special people God has brought into my life as friends, and the role they have played. How much they "cost me" in dollars is not remotely on the radar. Especially in the church and among Christian friends, there are countless opportunities to share in activities of service, outreach, or simply being present with one another.

Vacation Bible School is happening this summer. What a great place to make friends — whether young or old! Come to meet the youth in our church and surrounding neighborhoods.
